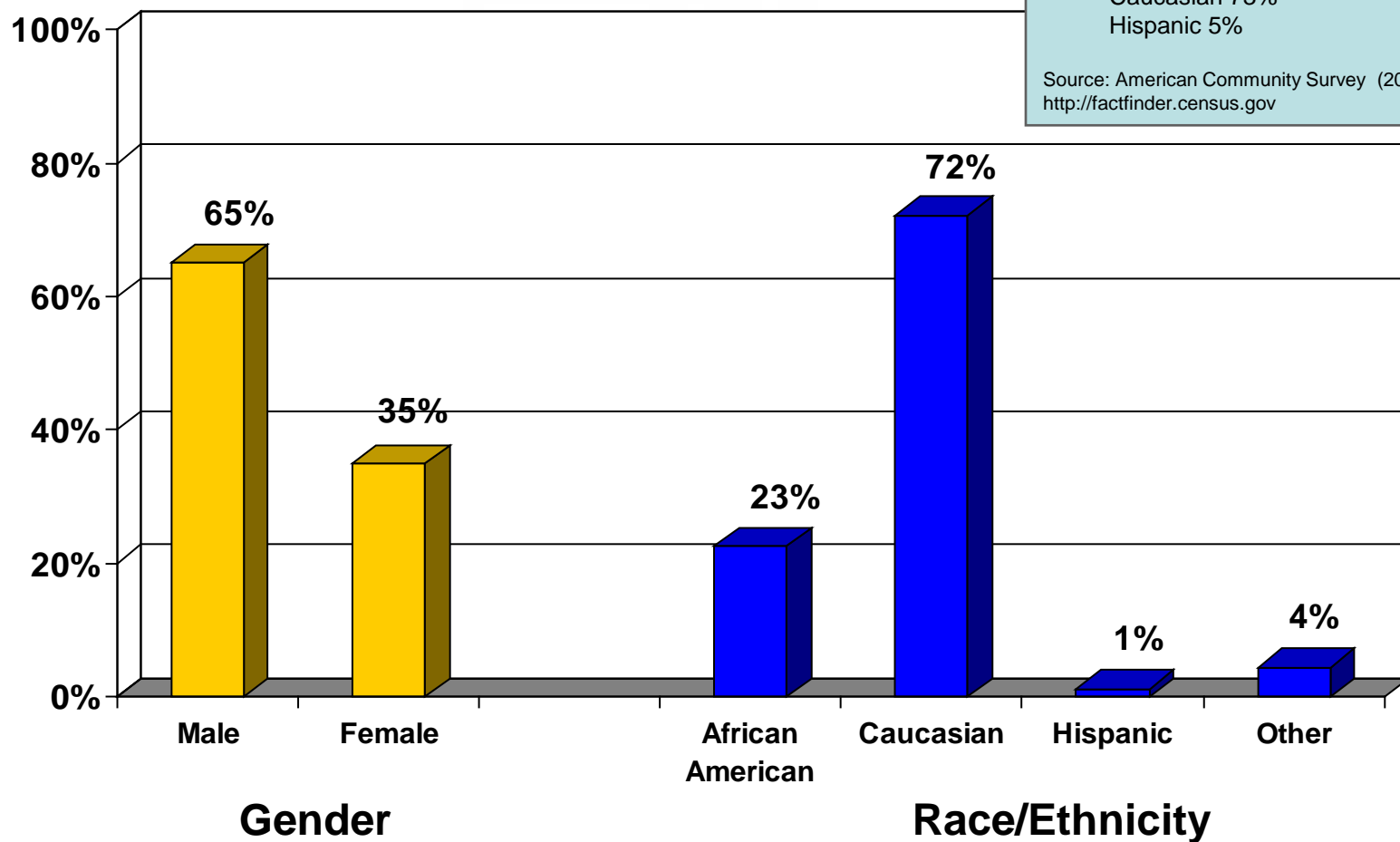

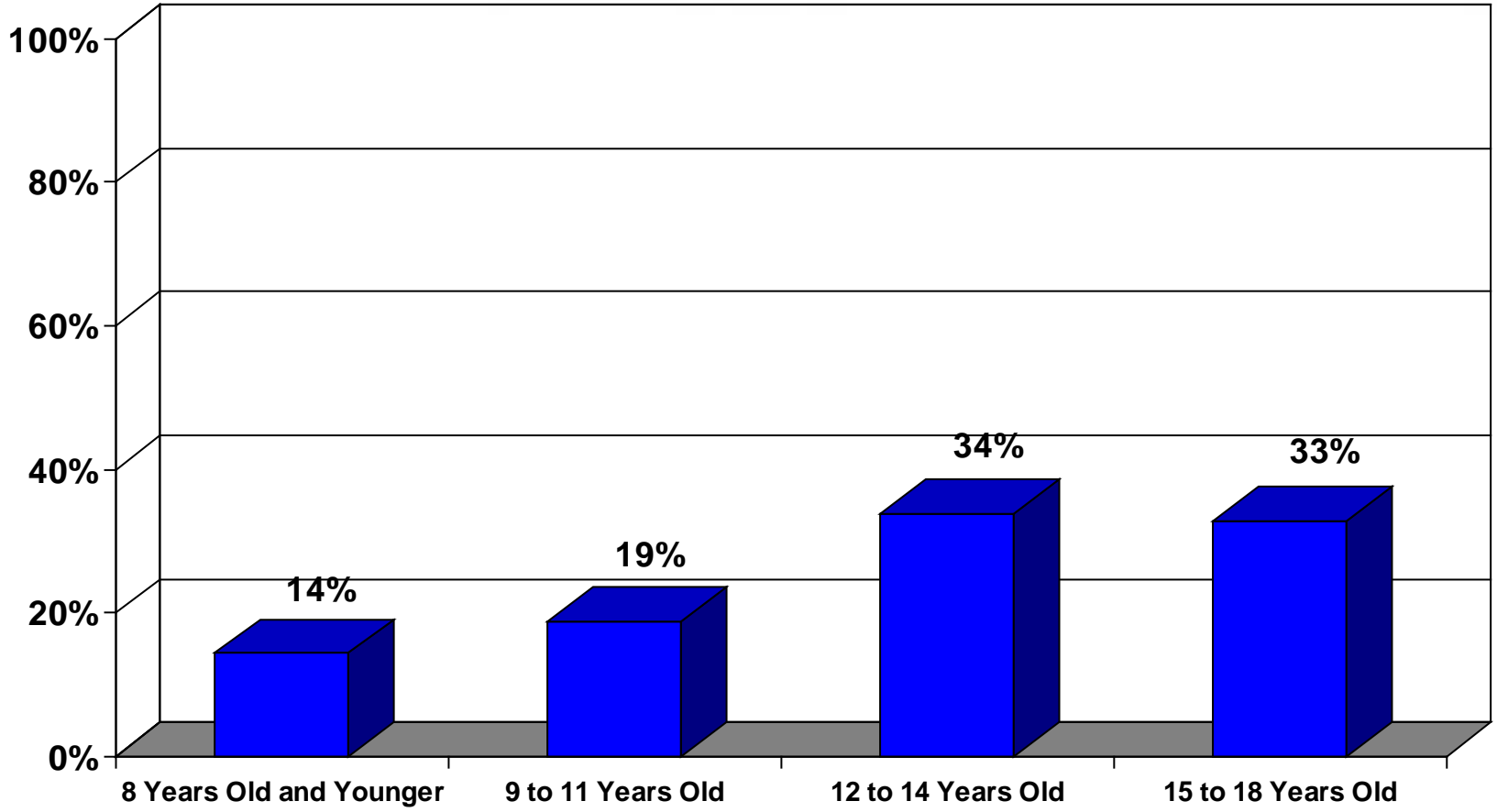

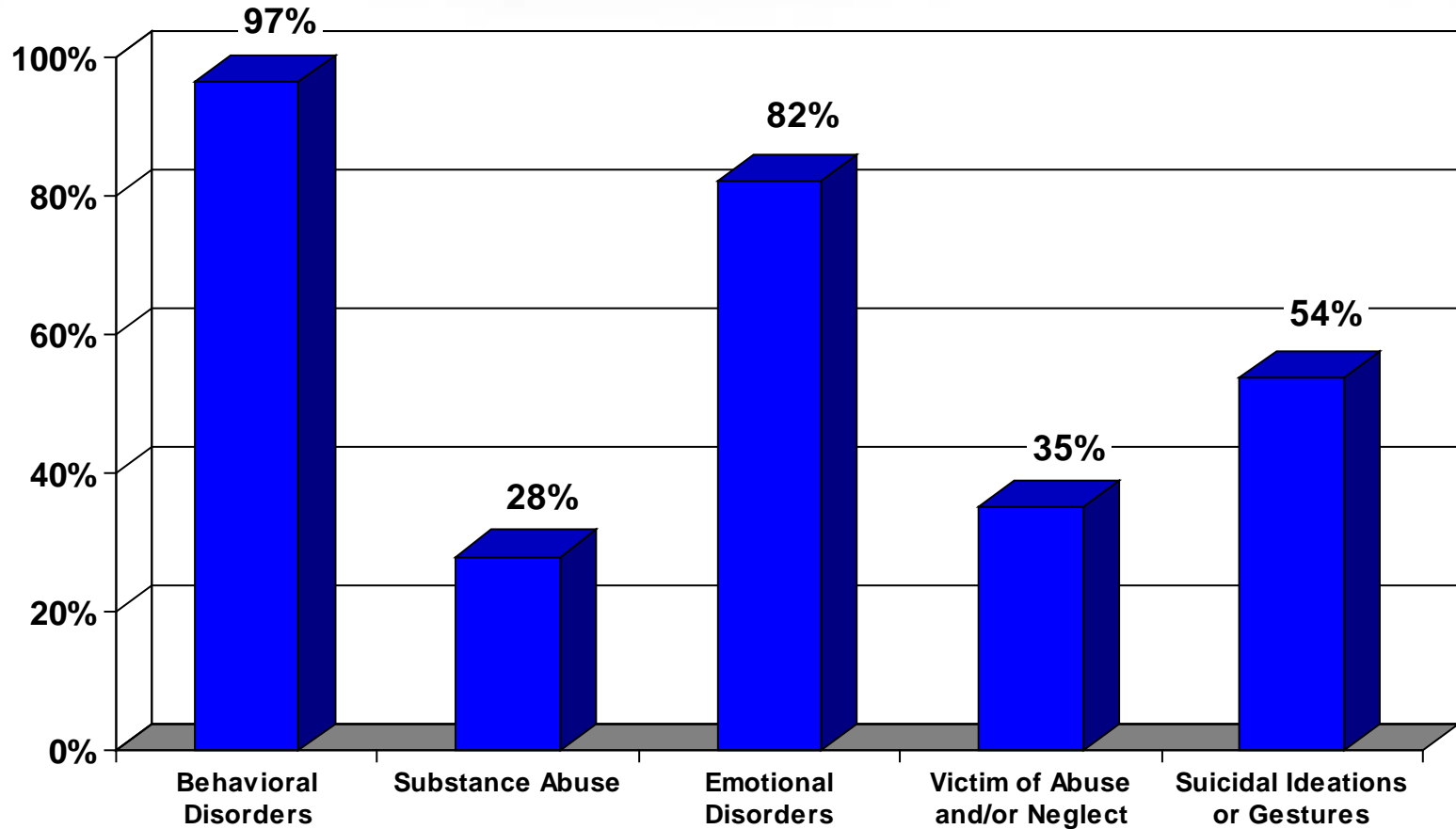

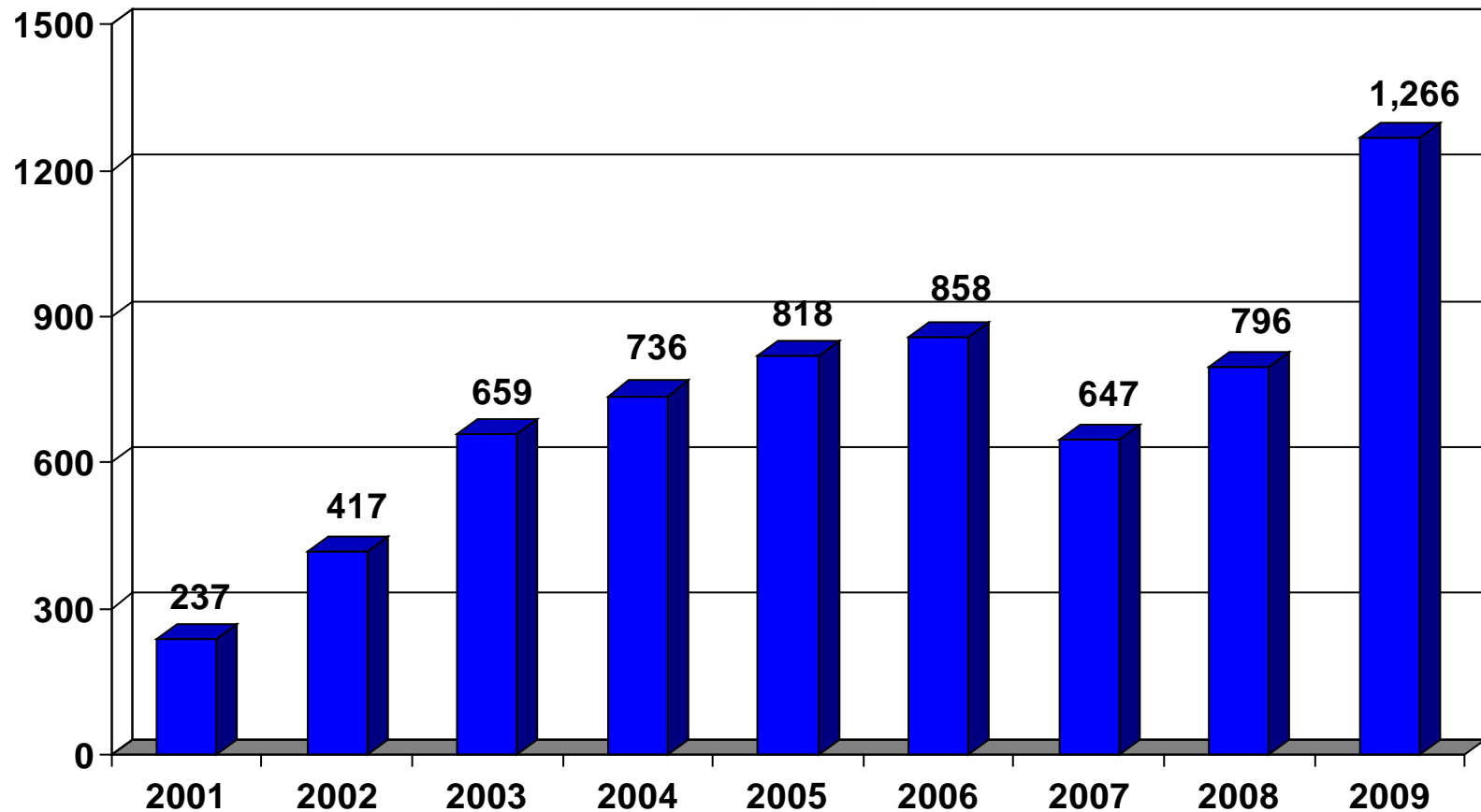
Over 93% of youth have multiple presenting issues

Youth may have multiple admissions to the In-Home Counseling Program

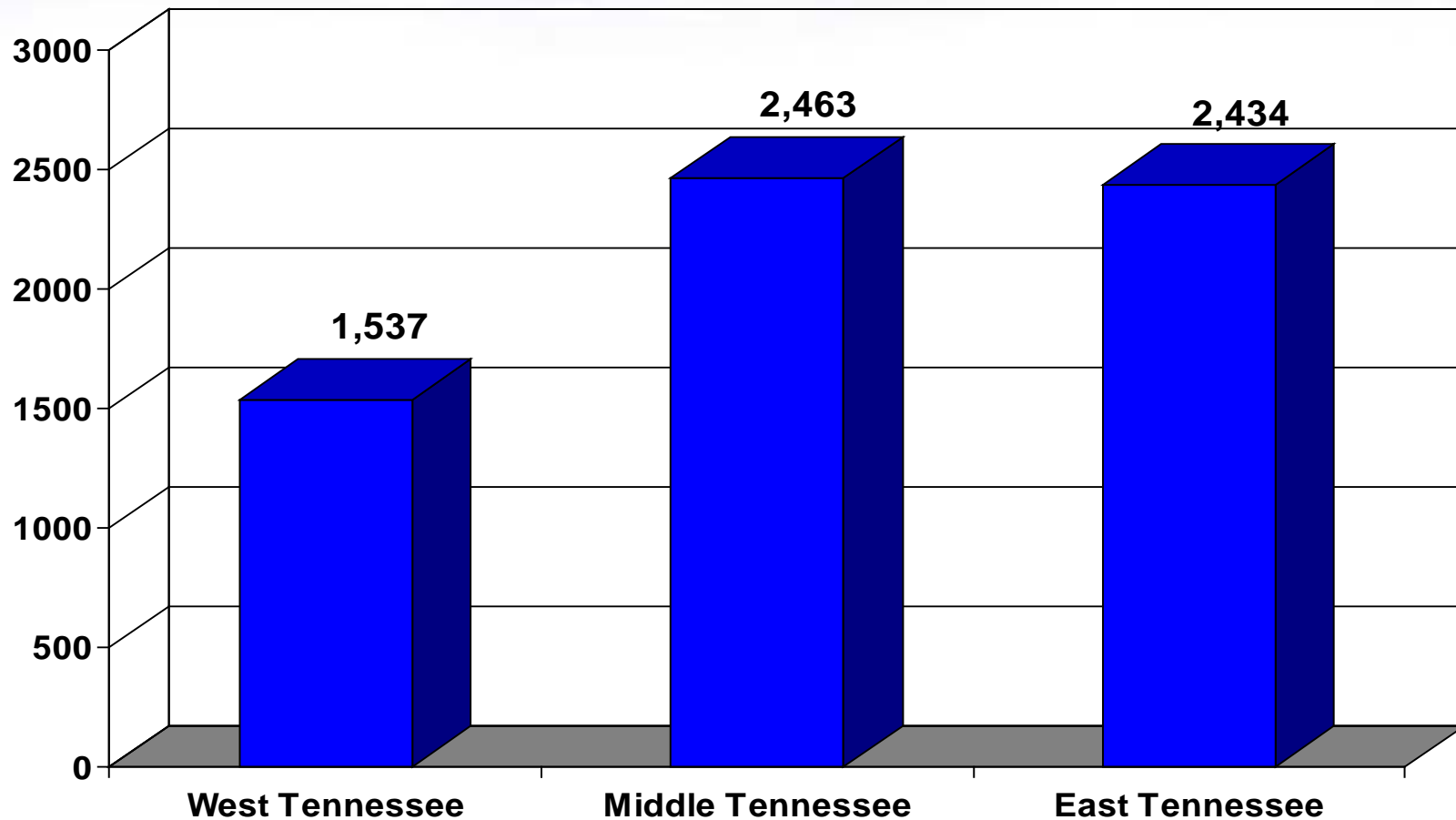
Fiscal Year – July 1 to June 30

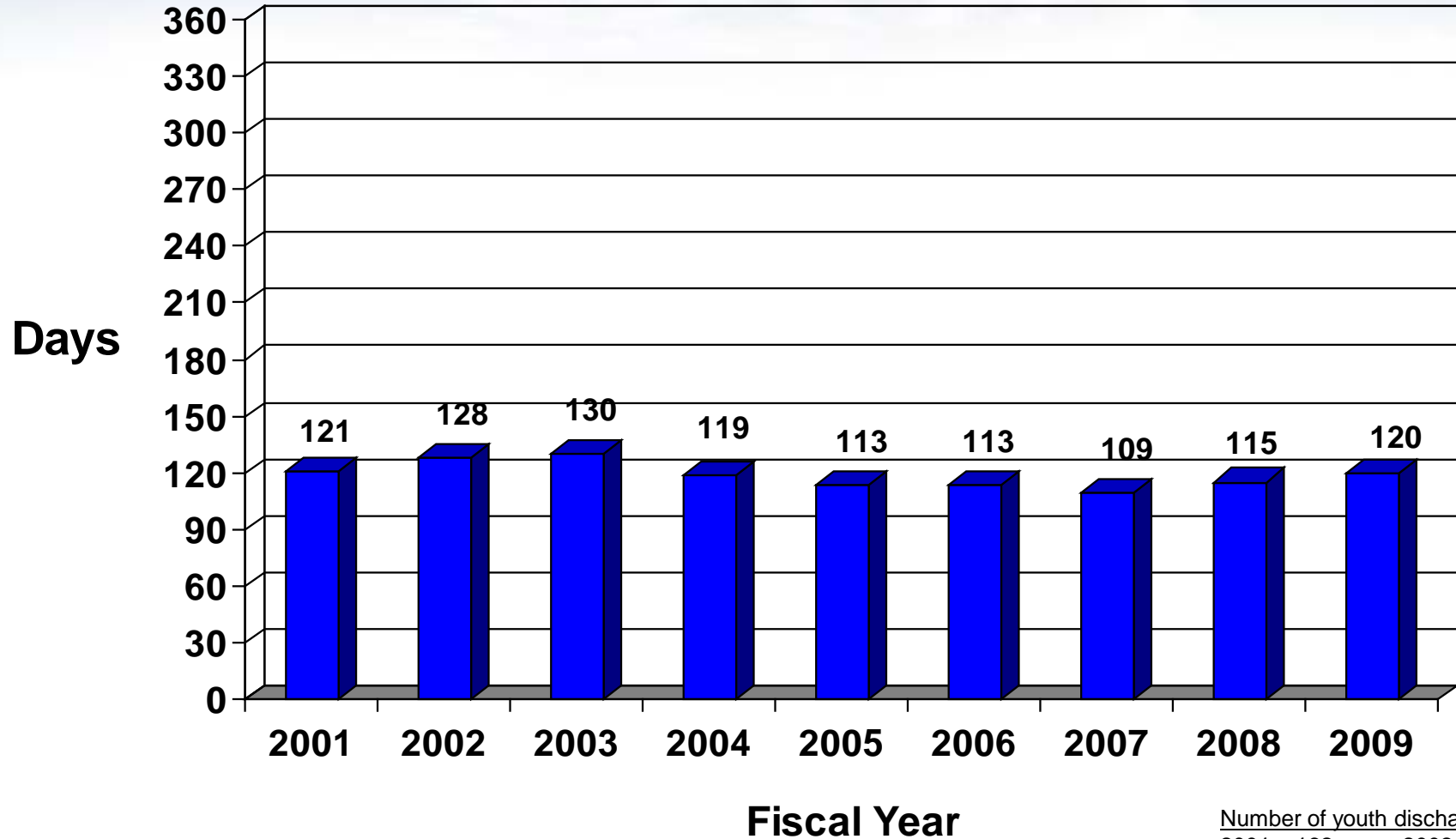

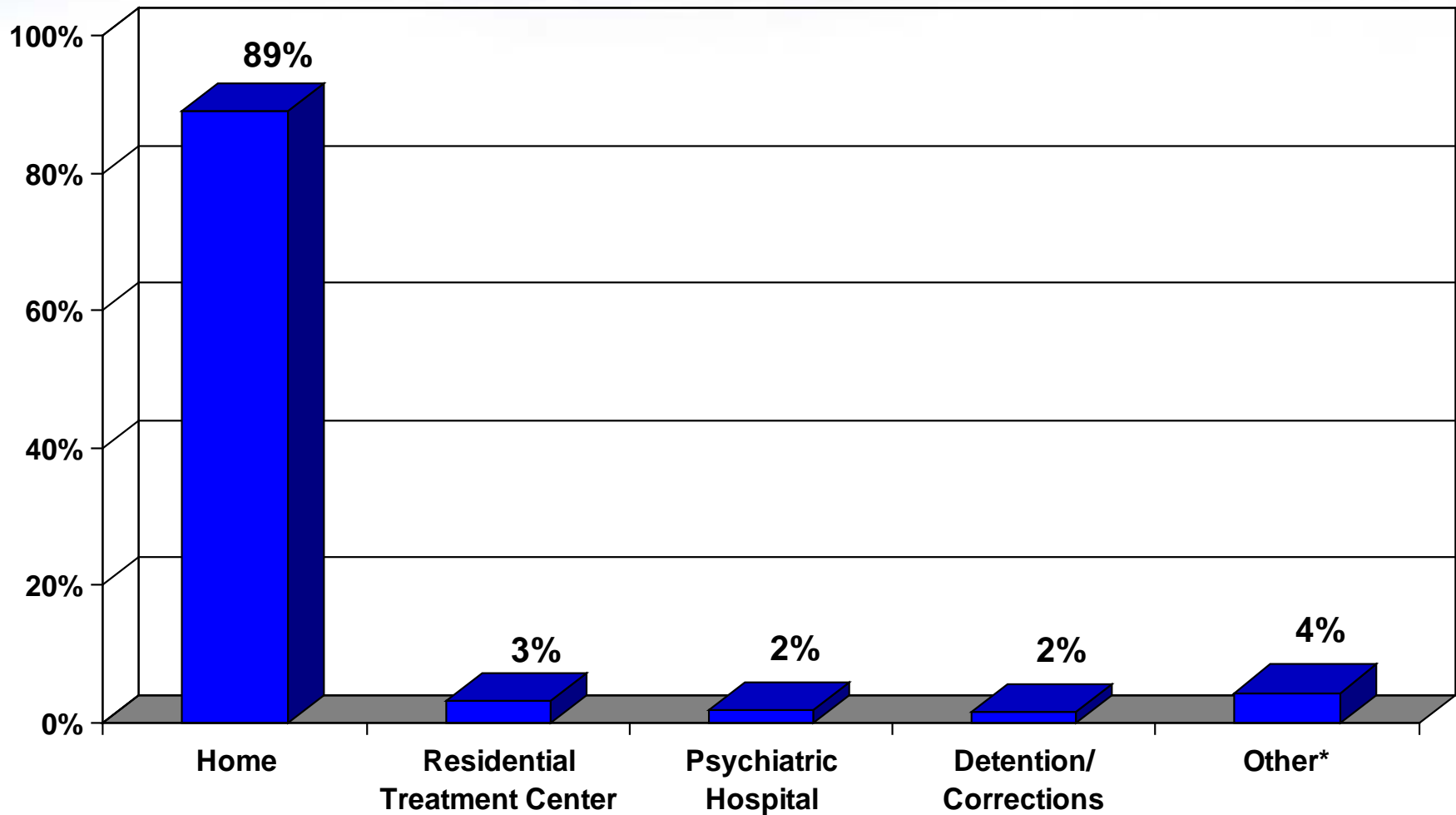

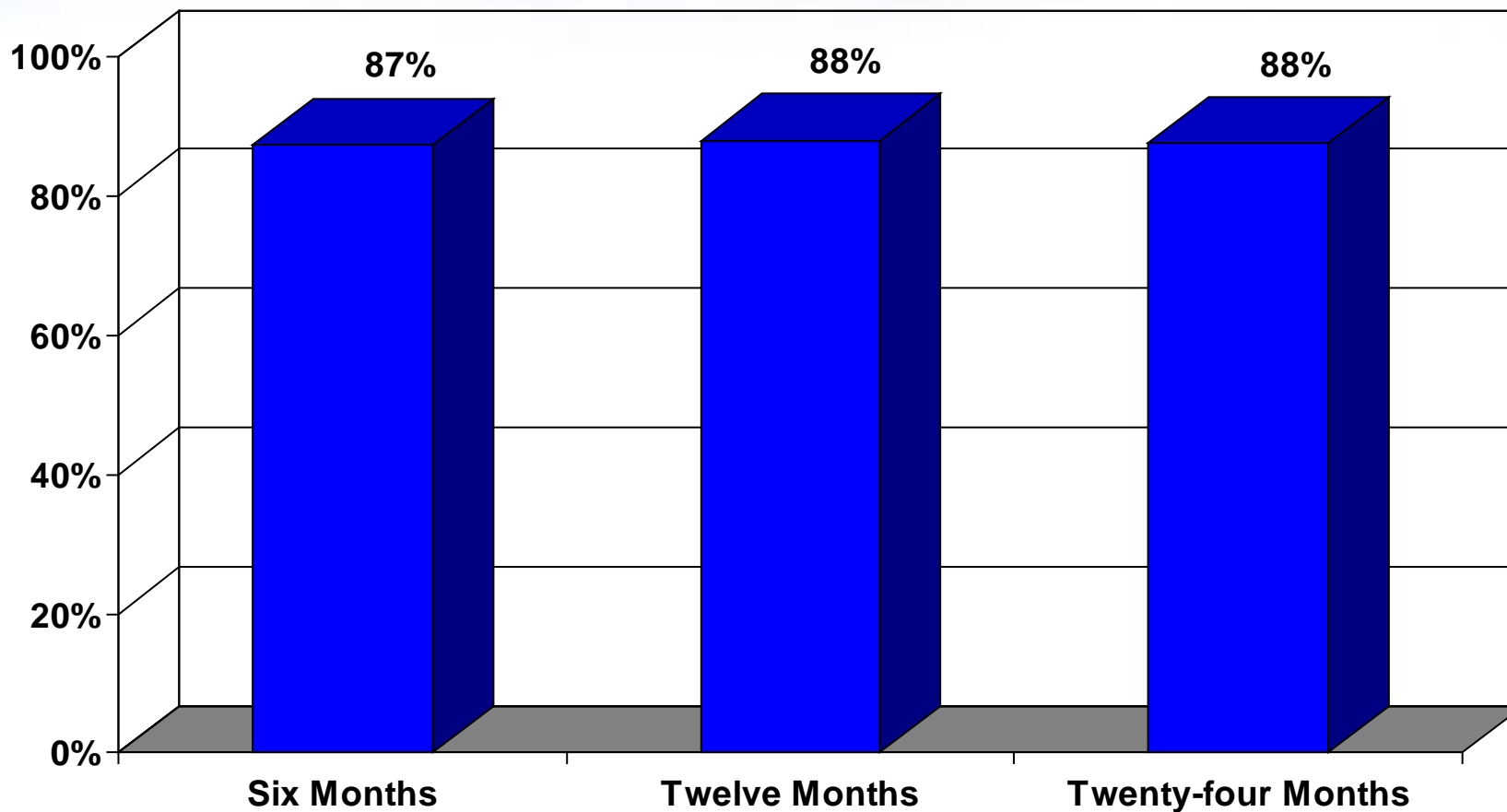

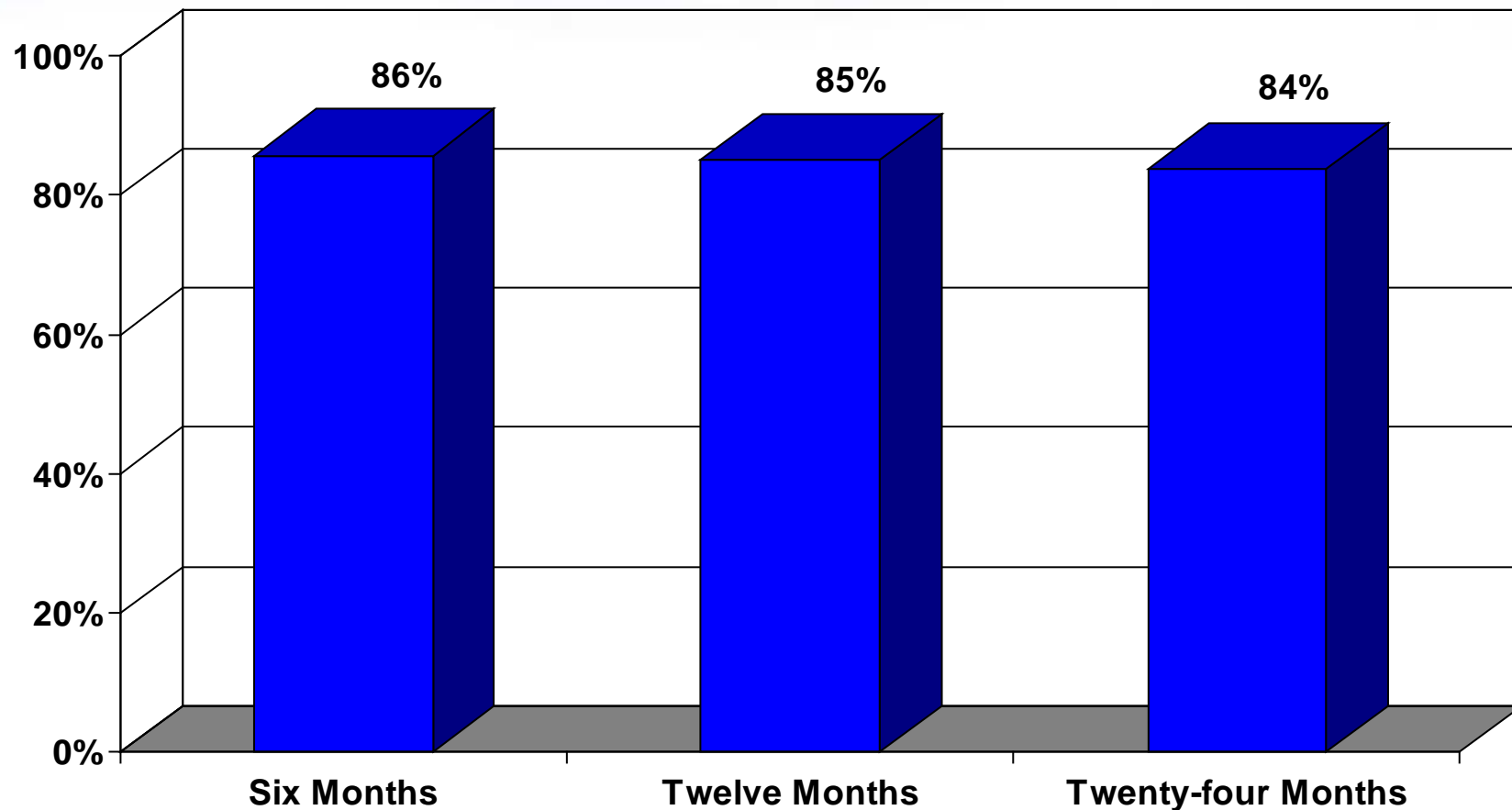

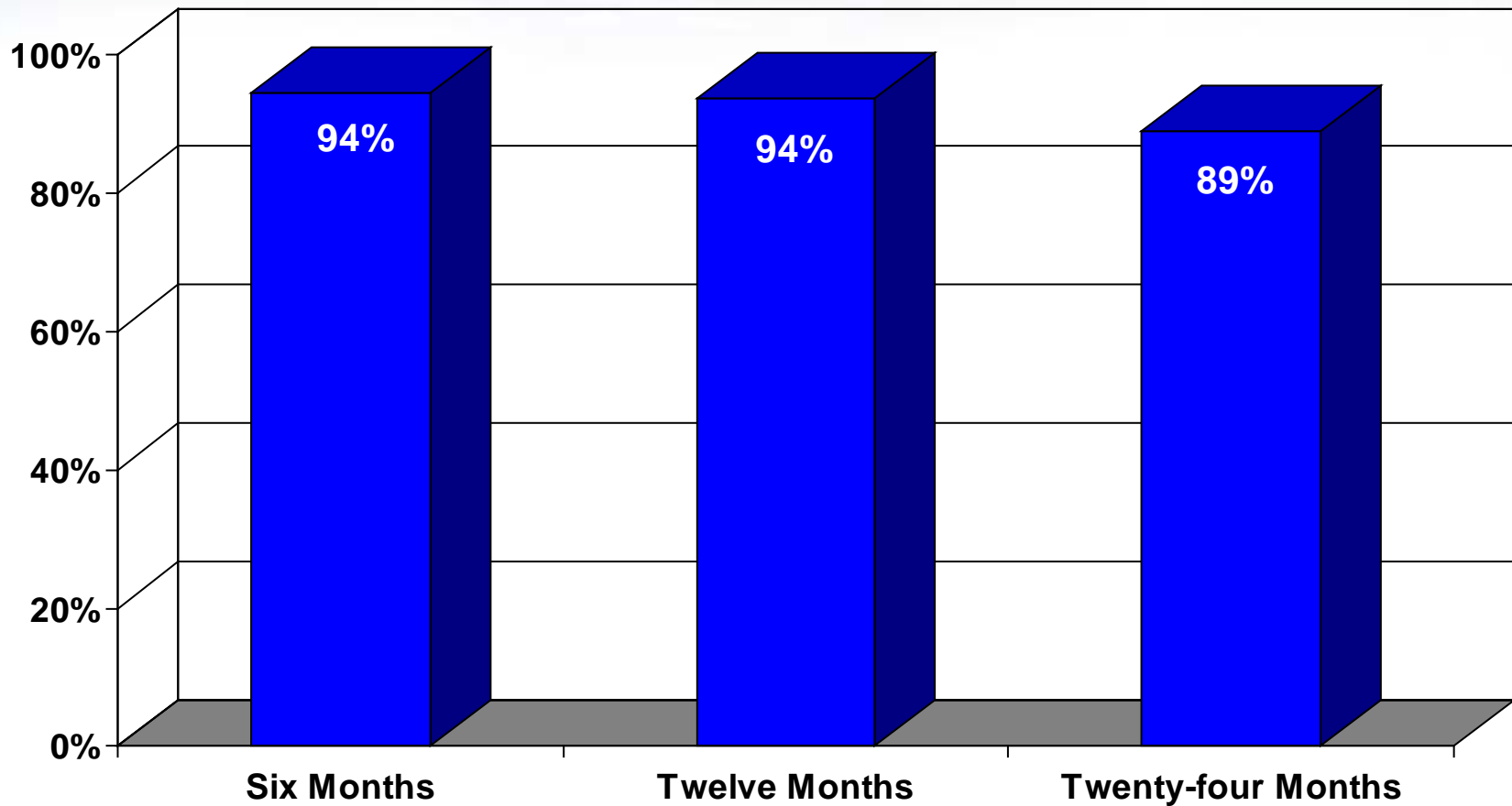

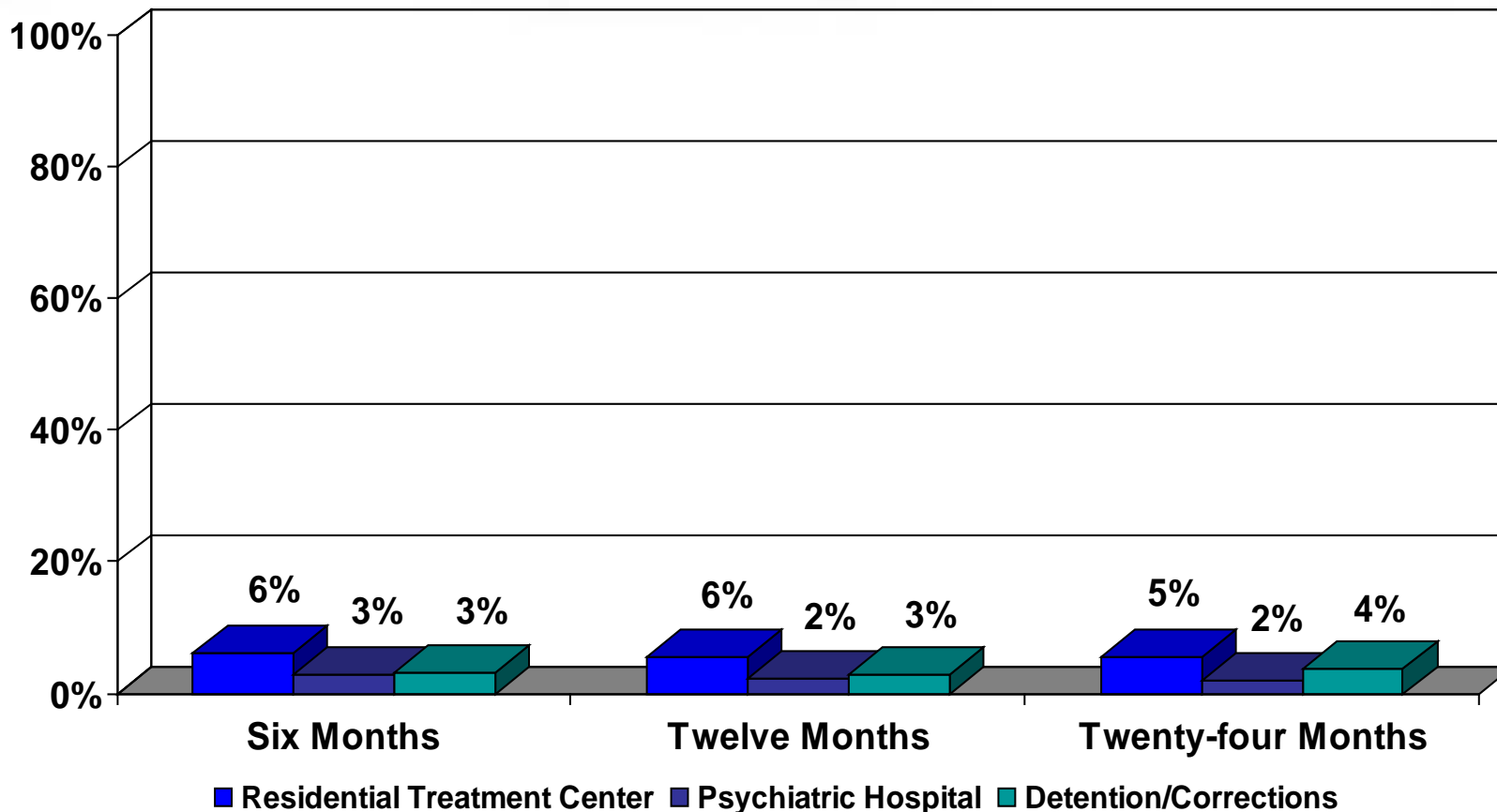

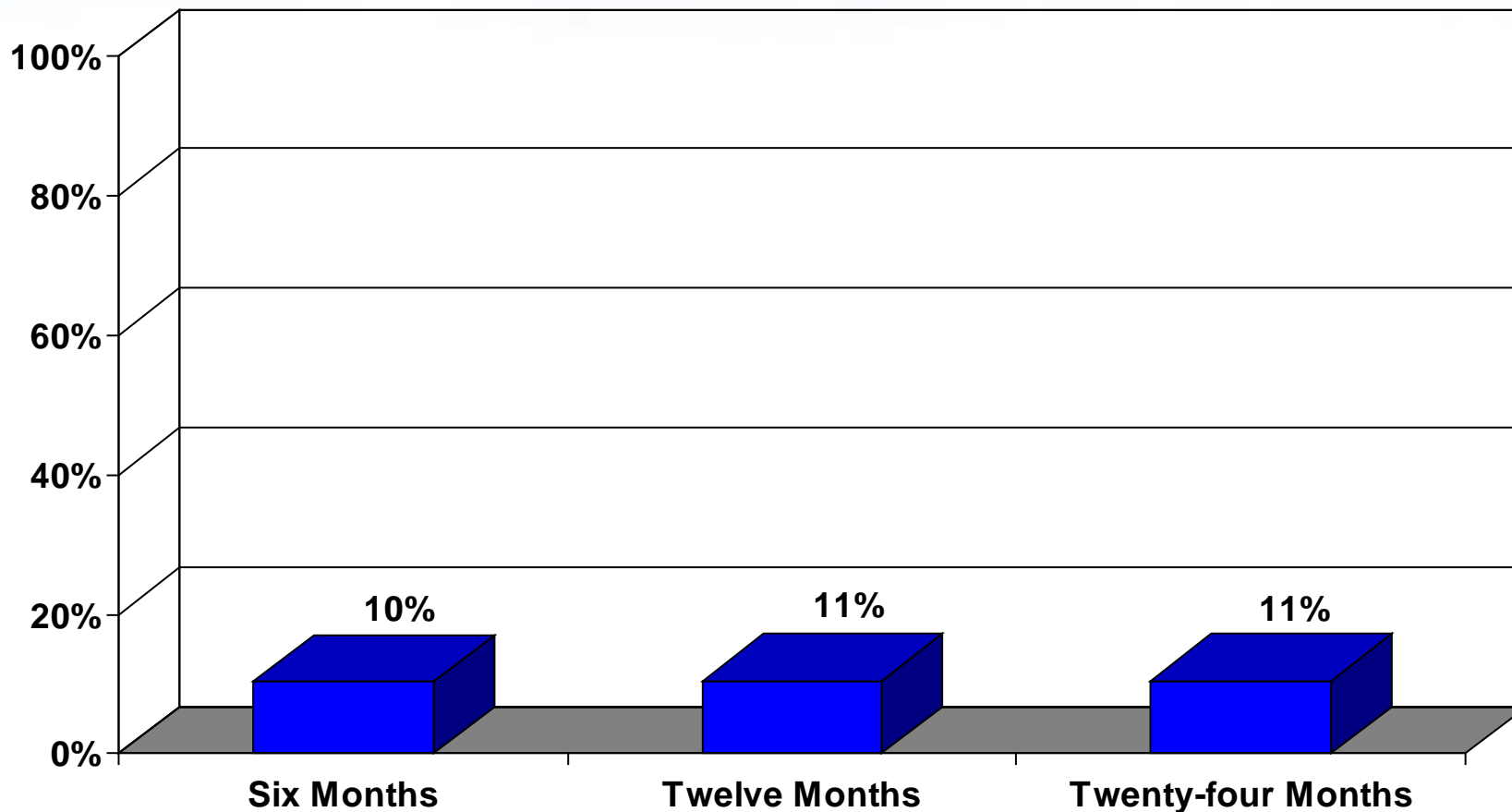
